Dear Friends,

I have just completed my portion of the Parochial Report and have good news to share. Things are going very well at St. Paul's. Our active members has increased from 124 to 134. Average weekly attendance, which includes the Wednesday service and services at Queenstown Landing is now 93, up 16. Average Sunday attendance is 75, an increase of 13. The average median Sunday attendance for the Episcopal Church is 35. We had an excellent stewardship campaign with just under \$295,000 in pledges-the highest in our history and 65 pledges, the highest number in 7 years. Thanks to all of our parishioners for your faithfulness and generosity. Praise to God for all the blessings we have received!

We are a vibrant, talented parish with much to offer as a community of faith. During Lent, I will be concentrating on raising awareness about all of the ministries we are involved in, in the hopes that we can encourage greater participation by a greater number of parishioners. Perhaps God is calling you to help with one of the areas related to worship-to serve as an usher or reader. Perhaps you are being called to help pack backpacks for hungry children in Centreville. There are many wonderful opportunities. Stay tuned!

Thomas Beard will be joining us on Sunday, February 25th for the service at 10:00 am. He will be singing two songs.

Lyric-dramatic baritone Thomas Beard is originally from Fayetteville, North Carolina. In 2003 Mr. Beard became the only African-American to be personally chosen by Maestro Placido Domingo to be a part of Washington National Opera's Young Artist program. Thomas remained there as Artist in Residence until 2006, working directly under the tutelage of Maestro Domingo.

As a member of The Washington Opera Thomas performed more than 90 times, including the company's tour of Japan. He has performed with numerous companies including the International Opera of Rome, Cape Fear Regional Theatre, Vermont Opera, Annapolis Opera, Pittsburgh Opera Theatre, Queen Anne's Chorale, Easton Choral Arts Society, Jacksonville Symphony Orchestra and the Virginia Consort.

Mr. Beard has often performed for U.S. senators, governors and ambassadors at embassies and concert halls across the country. He sang at the funeral of Rosa Parks, mother of the civil rights movement, and performed at the White House at the invitation of former first lady Laura Bush.



- Holy Baptism is especially appropriate at the Easter Vigil, on the Day of Pentecost, on All Saints' Day or the Sunday after All Saints' Day, and on the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord (the First Sunday after the Epiphany). It is recommended that, as far as possible, Baptisms be reserved for these occasions or when a bishop is present. (BCP 312)



We'll gather with our brown bag lunches, and journals and curiosity.


